Subject : Extension for withholding tax and value-added tax filing via internet to the end of the due month, to reduce risk from the COVID-19 situation and increase liquidity

The Revenue Department recommends entrepreneurs to file withholding and value-added tax returns via the internet at www.rd.go.th to receive the extension of submission and payment till the last day of the due month. This is to help the entrepreneurs prolong financial liquidity. It is also more convenient and safe, reduces the need to travel, and maintains social distancing, and thus, prevents the spread of COVID-19.

Mrs. Sommai Siriudomset, Principal Advisor on Strategic Tax Administration (Energy Industry), as the spokesperson of the Revenue Department revealed that, “Since 26th January 2021, the cabinet has approved the extension of withholding tax filing and remittance (P.N.D. 1, P.N.D. 2, P.N.D. 3, P.N.D. 53 and P.N.D. 54) and value-added tax filing (P.P. 30 and P.P. 36) for those submitting tax returns on the internet, so that they can file tax returns and pay for tax until the last day of the due month. As a result, the number of the entrepreneurs who file withholding tax and value-added tax online has increased. This will help both corporate and individual entrepreneurs, who are receiving impacts from the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, increase financial liquidity and flexibility because they get the extension of tax filing and payment till the end of the due month.”

The Spokesperson added that, “Due to the current situation of the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, the Revenue Department has concerns over the entrepreneurs and the taxpayers’ safety. Therefore, we would like to invite everyone to use our tax service, called TAX from Home, available on the Revenue Department website www.rd.go.th. The service is easy to use, convenient, and safe. It also reduces the need to travel, maintains social distancing, and thus, helps reduce and prevent the spread of the coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) effectively.”
